Course Title: Called and Chosen: Unleashing the Power of the Laity in Today's Church

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2. Course Description

This course explores the vital mission of the laity in the life of the Church. Drawing from the teachings of Vatican II (Lumen Gentium, Apostolicam Actuositatem) and the Code of Canons of the Eastern Churches (CCEO), we will rediscover the dignity and power of lay Catholics, especially within the Maronite tradition. Through theological reflection, canonical insight, and inspiring examples of lay saints—including the newly canonized Massabki brothers—participants will be equipped to live out their vocation fully, whether in family life, the workplace, or parish service.

3. Course Objectives

- Understand the theological and canonical identity of the lay faithful
- Recognize their personal vocation as a path to sanctity and apostolate
- Become familiar with the canonical rights and responsibilities of laypeople (especially in the Maronite Church)
- Reflect on lay saints and apply their witness to contemporary life

• Develop concrete ways to bring faith into home, work, and society

Readings: Familiaris Consortio §§49–52; CCEO Canons 1357–1364

• Dec 4, 2025 – Faith in a Digital World

Readings: Apostolicam Actuositatem ch. 5; Christifideles Laici §§30–36; CCEO Canons 573–583

• Dec 18, 2025 – Evangelization: Gospel Witness

Readings: Evangelii Nuntiandi §§70–73; CCEO Canons 588–594
